- **Family Skating** times vary by site. Visit hamilton.ca for more info.


HOW DOES LEARNING HAPPEN?

As outlined in the Umbrella Program Handbook, the starting point for curriculum in the Umbrella programs is the belief that children are curious, capable and they learn best by pursuing their own interests and goals in a carefully designed learning environment.

Staff members use the document *How does Learning Happen? Ontario's Pedagogy for the Early Years* as set out by the Ministry of Education, as a guide in supporting developmentally appropriate practice. This document includes expectations for programs centered on four foundations that are considered to be key ingredients for optimal learning and healthy development. These foundations are: Belonging, Well Being, Engagement and Expression. Goals for children include:

- Every child has a sense of belonging when he or she is connected to others and contributes to their world.
- Every child is developing a sense of self, health, and wellbeing.
- Every child is an active and engaged learner who explores the world with body, mind, and senses.
- Every child is a capable communicator who expresses himself or herself in many ways.

Connie Cortina is an Area Supervisor at Umbrella. She writes: "You won't find an inspired Educator saying that a child has too many limitations to learning or that children have no



interest." Connie goes on to say: "Learning is always possible! Open ended questions, open ended materials, enthusiastic attitudes, and a positive learning environment are HOW learning happens under the Umbrella!"

Connie sent the photo you see here with a note that said: "Simon Nicholson is an architect who developed the Theory of Loose Parts. This theory comes to life where loose parts such as objects and materials can be moved around, designed and redesigned to create endless opportunities for creative learning opportunities! Take a look at how this simple activity thoughtfully incorporates all the foundations of learning described in *How Does Learning Happen, Ontario's Pedagogy for the Early Years*. The result indicates a sense of belonging, feeling connected, well being, a sense of self, engagement and creative thinking."

The photo is an example of how children's thinking and learning is recorded by educators through photographs and written observation and posted in the program for the review and consideration of both children and adults.
