

## SCHOOL BREAK PROGRAMS

Full day programs are offered in Umbrella full day program locations (Ancaster Meadow, Cathy Wever, Gatestone, Hillcrest, Lawfield, Lincoln Alexander, Ray Lewis, Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Templemead) during School Breaks for Kindergarten and School Age children.

#### MARCH BREAK 2019 IS MARCH 11-15

Registration Forms for March Break will be accepted starting on Monday, January 28th at 7 a.m. and children from all Umbrella program locations are confirmed on a first come, first served basis.



In addition to regular programming, kindergarten children will travel by school bus to Zippy Zooms, an indoor playground. They will also be visited in their sites by "In The Mix", who will introduce the foundations of yoga with interactive stories, music, and props to engage awareness and self confidence.

School age children will be visited by the "Umbrella Sports Guys" who will offer a sports program in the school gym and also visit the Young People's Theatre in Toronto to take in a special blacklight performance.

#### **SUMMER PROGRAMS 2019**

Kindergarten children typically enjoy a program offered in one of the Umbrella full day program locations, with weekly off-site trips.

Each week of camp, School Age children will have two days at Fifty Point Conservation Area, two days at their Umbrella full day program location and a field trip day. This allows us to provide a wide variety of programming all summer long.

#### CHILDCARE AFFORDABILITY PLAN

Licensed child care is now more affordable in Hamilton. The Child Care Affordability Plan is an initiative of the City of Hamilton funded by the Provincial Government to reduce the cost of child care for families.

This initiative has reduced the rates for children 0-4 years of age to attend licensed child care centres for a full day by \$10 per day. The intent of this initiative is to reduce the cost of child care for families that do not qualify for child care fee subsidy. Families eligible for child care fee subsidy will continue to pay child care fees based on their income.

Ongoing sustainability of this initiative will be dependent on the Ministry of Education's 2019 funding to the City of Hamilton. Therefore families should be aware that the reduction in child care rates could be discontinued if the initiative ends. Child care centres will be provided reasonable notice if the initiative ends so that families can be informed and plan accordingly.
